

【本報消息】澳門城市大學繼續教育學院自成立以來，致力推動終身學習，服務社會，努力為澳門和鄰近地區學生提供多元的國際考試機會。去年成為 TOEIC 多益考試中心後，參加考試人數已約二千人。今年初也開始提供托福 (TOEFL) 測驗、托福 (ITP-Institutional Testing Program) 測驗、TFI 法語水平國際考試等。學院在今年中開始計劃申報成為 SAT 考試中心，並於八月正式獲得美國考試服務中心 (ETS) 的批准。同時，學院也為負責 SAT 考試監考的人員提供專業培訓，使他們能夠應付嚴謹的考試程序和規則。

SAT 考試是由美國大學委員會委託美國教育考試服務社 (ETS) 定期舉辦的考試，作為美國各大學申請入學的重要參考條件之一。也是世界各國高中生申請進入美國大學本科學習及獲得獎學金的重要參考，它對錄取與否及獎學金多少的影響非常大。而且美國的名牌大學都要求世界各地的學生提交 SAT 成績。

Increasing number of SAT test takers worldwide ...

More than 2 million students in the class of 2018 took the SAT, making it the most widely used college admission test.


The number of students taking the SAT hit an all-time high: 2.1 million in the class of 2018. By comparison, the rival ACT had 1.9 million test-takers. The surge in test-taking helped the SAT reclaim its former status as the most widely used college admission test, a position ACT had held since 2012.

What is the SAT Test?

- ▶ The SAT is owned, published, and developed by the **College Board**, a nonprofit organization in the United States.
- ▶ It was formerly developed, published, and scored by the Educational Testing Service which still administers the exam.
- ▶ The **SAT and SAT Subject Tests** belong to the SAT Suite of Assessments designed to ***assess your academic readiness for college.***



The SAT - understanding your scores

- ▶ SAT scores are reported on a scale from **200-800 for each section**, with additional subscores reported for the essay (ranging from 2-12) and for multiple-choice writing questions (on a 20-80 scale).



What are the SAT Subject Tests?

- ▶ SAT Subject Tests are 1 hour-long, **content-based tests** that allow students to **showcase achievement in specific subject areas** where they excel.
- ▶ SAT Subject Tests allow students to differentiate themselves in the college admission process or send a strong message regarding their readiness to study specific majors or programs in college.
- ▶ There are **20 SAT Subject Tests** in five general subject areas: **English, history, languages, mathematics and science**.





Online score report— View result summary

▶ Paper Score Reports

Students who register online and wish to receive a paper score report by mail in addition to the online score report must request it when they register.

Students who register by mail and who don't have active College Board online accounts will receive paper score reports. They can also get their SAT scores by calling customer service, but there's an additional fee.

▶ Scores by Phone

You can get [SAT scores by phone](#) starting on the day they're released, but there's an [extra fee](#).

▶ Who Else Sees Your Scores

If you chose score recipients before scores were released, those colleges and scholarship programs will get your score report shortly after you do. Your high school, district, and state will be able to see your scores online too.

Understanding Your Critical Reading Score

The critical reading section contains two types of multiple-choice questions:

- Sentence-completion questions test your vocabulary and how well you understand sentence structure.



ESSAY IMAGE

Writing is a core skill needed for success in both college and the workplace. Research has shown that a student's ability to write a first draft of a short, timed essay relates positively to the student's ability to perform successfully in college courses that require writing.



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
